In 2021, thanks to funding from the Future Skills Center, NPower Canada partnered with Blueprint to conduct a randomized controlled trial (RCT) to assess the effectiveness of its programs. RCTs are a rigorous research method and powerful evaluation tool to compare the outcomes of a treatment group, who participate in the program, and a comparison group, who do not participate in the program. In this session, Nisha Lewis will provide an overview of NPower Canada's RCT, share key challenges, lessons learned, and reflections on navigating evidence-building in a mission-driven context.
